In some cases, candidates may not be able to represent some of the subjects listed from direct observation during the examination itself, in particular Interiors and Exteriors. In these cases, it is permissible to produce supporting studies from direct observation and to produce the final examination piece using the supporting studies as a reference point.

At the end of the examination, fasten **all** your work securely together at the top left-hand corner of each sheet.

All questions in this paper carry equal marks.



1 Still Life Group

- **Either** (a) A number of brightly coloured balls of different sizes are arranged within the folds of a white sheet or similar material.
- **Or (b)** 'Fresh from the Garden.' Make a group of suitable items which reflects this theme.

2 Natural and Man-made Objects

Make a study **or** studies from **one** of the following:

- (a) A crustacean or other shellfish.
- (b) A pair of sunglasses.
- (c) A tangle of foliage.

3 The Human Figure

- **Either** (a) One or two people are dressed in sportswear and are seated as if waiting for a game to start. They are holding a suitable bat, racket or ball. The whole of the figure or figures should be drawn or painted.
- **Or (b)** A portrait study of a person wearing a brightly coloured scarf either around their head or neck. As well as the head, the upper body and hands should be included.

4 Interiors or Exteriors

Either (a) A night market.

Or (b) Reflections in water.

Or (c) An overgrown pathway.
