Percentage of the population living on less than US\$1 per day

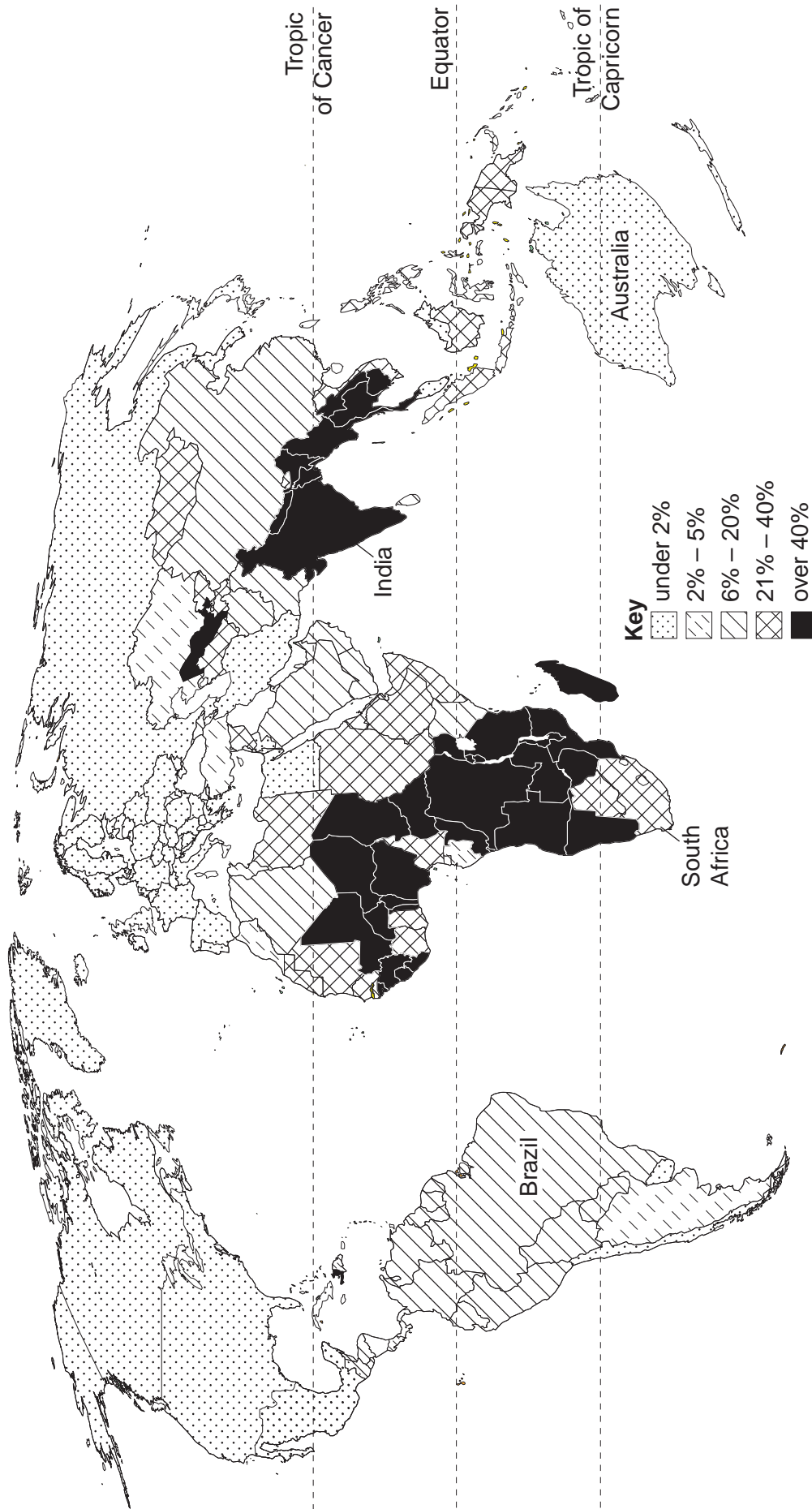
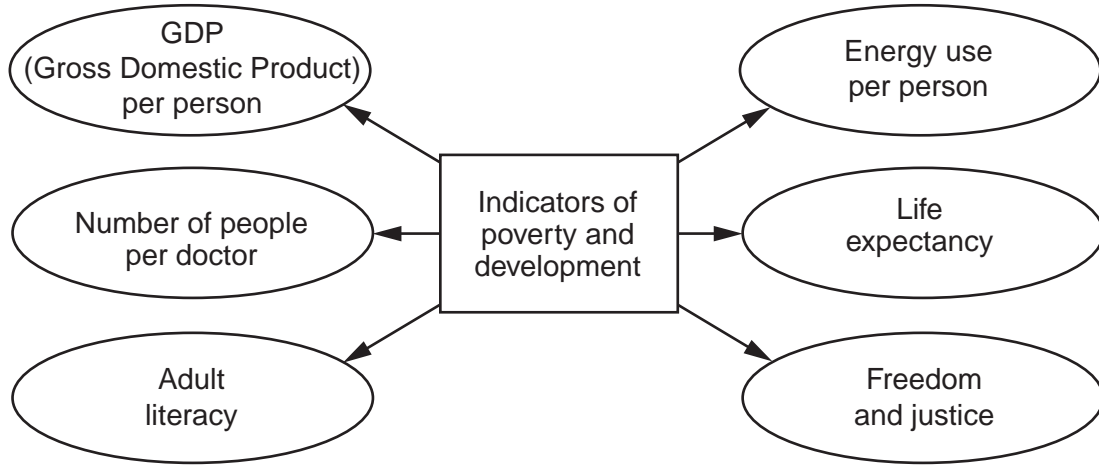


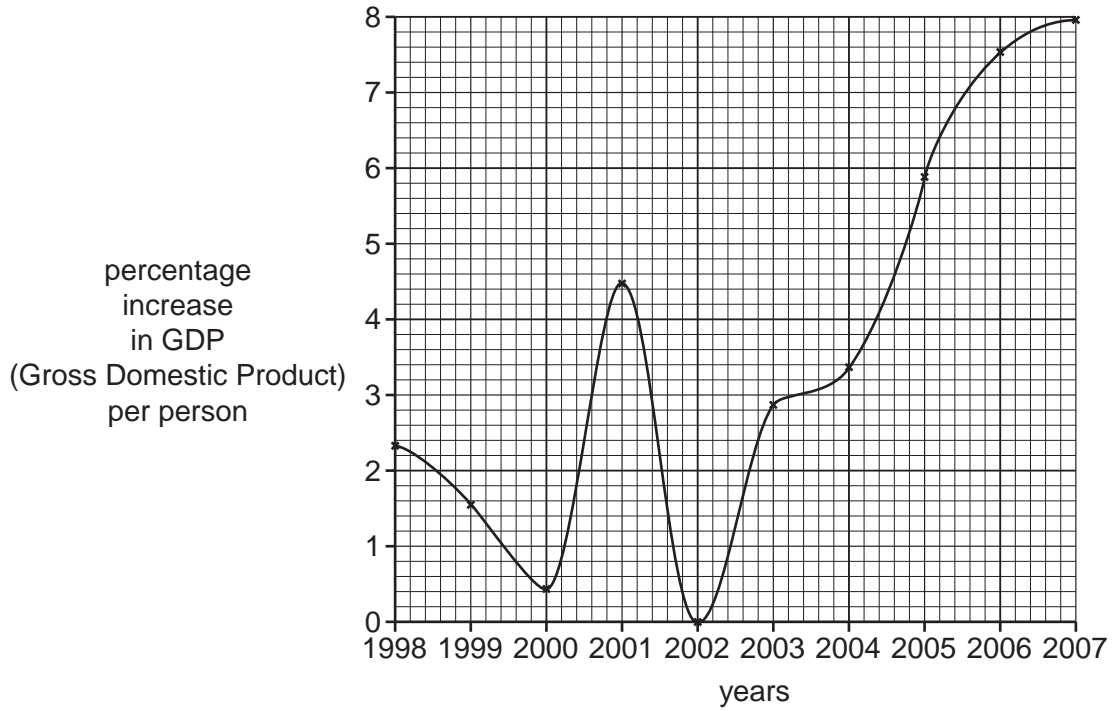

**Percentage increase in GDP per person in Kenya**

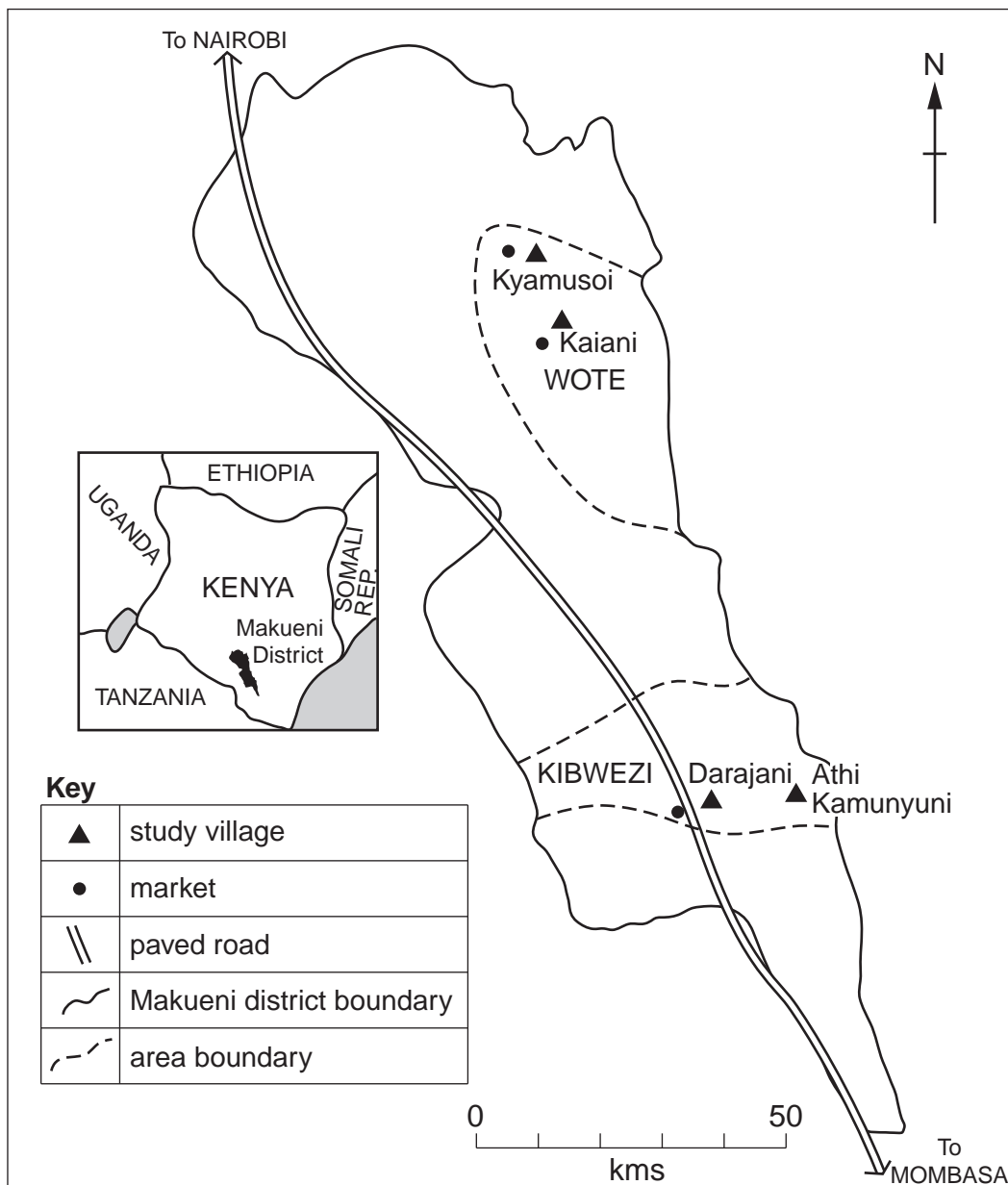

An investigation was carried out in two different areas in the Makueni District, Wote and Kibwezi. Wote lies at a high altitude and experiences higher rainfall, whereas Kibwezi is in a lowland area with a dry climate. The level of development in the Makueni District is generally low, with unpaved roads throughout the area. The exception is the main Nairobi-Mombasa road which crosses Kibwezi. The majority of people get water directly from the rivers, dams and boreholes, or from tanks on their roofs.

For this study two villages each were chosen from Wote and Kibwezi. Three of the villages are less than three hours' walk away from a market.
