OR Unintelligible, nonsensical responses. NOTE: The summary must be sentences that are grammatically correct (allow or error). There may be punctuation / spelling errors. ALSO: award 1 mark where candidates have included ALL FOUR pieces of information in bullet points within the word limit. Allow 'freshwater' as one word even where the candidate has split it into two.
